

How do I recognise an electrical appliance?

Five features

Cable or plug?

Does my device have a cable or plug that connects directly to the mains?

Examples

- Mixers or toasters
- Electric lawn mowers
- Coffee machines or electric kettles

Accumulator or batteries?

Does my device contain an accumulator or batteries?

Examples

- Shavers
- E-cigarettes
- Robots or game consoles
- Toy cars or instruments

Bulbs or lights?

Is my device used to generate light?

Examples

- Low-energy bulbs, spotlights or LEDs
- Floor lamps, table lamps and ceiling lights

Refrigerator or air-conditioner?

Is my device used for cooling or air-conditioning?

Examples

- Freezers and refrigerators
- Wine coolers
- Indoor climate devices
- Air-conditioning units

Solar cell?

Does my device have a solar cell, even a very small one?

Examples

- Photovoltaic modules
- Solar-powered garden lights

Where can I dispose of my electrical device?

Used electrical and electronic devices can be returned free of charge to sales outlets and retailers or SENS collection points.
